To start, we'd like to celebrate with you the launch of one of the businesses that we've been working on since we arrived. NossaRua (OurStreet) is our Lisbon based new brand inspired by Portugal's colourful streets and its traditional azulejo's designs.

After several weeks of design work (done entirely by Susan), followed by other so many weeks of production, we finally have in our hands this product. Last week we began the commercialisation of them, which gave us many opportunities to meet new people and engage in a deeper way with the Portuguese culture.

Soon, these decal tiles will also be available in Amazon UK. They're on their way, so give them a couple of days probably. We've also re-branded the Facebook FanPage, now NossaRua Decal Tiles UK.

We're very excited about this, not only for what it means to start our own business, but for the opportunities this gives us to engage with people and to develop relationships. We've had very good feedback from the shops to which we've offered them, but we haven't received any orders yet, as it's still low-season for the shops. We know we're on a stage of casting the nets into the market, so then we need to wait and trust God for His provision. It's been a good experience so far, which in some occasions it has even felt like being on "The Apprentice," though not fighting for a 1/4 million pounds ;) We thank God for His daily encouragement and help to stay focused on His mission while we do this.



Car Registration - Thanks God, we have now received the registration plate of our car. This has been a massive breakthrough, and another milestone during this season of settling-in. It also saved us quite a lot of money actually. Portugal is well-known for its very high taxes on cars. We also want to thank some friends who helped us in this process to get some documentation we needed from the UK. You know who you are, and we are so grateful for the support of the family of God.



Residency – This one has not yet come through, but it should be a matter of time. Right now, we are waiting for some documentation from Germany to submit to the Portuguese authorities. We didn't have other option than going the long way, really. So, we simply have to exercise patience.

Chile - Soon after we sent our previous letter, last October, Matias' sister (Consuelo) told us she is getting married, aaaaand that she wanted Matias to officiate her wedding.
